### **About TI-Kenya**

Transparency International Kenya (TI-Kenya) is a not-for-profit organization founded in 1999 in Kenya with the aim of developing a transparent and corruption-free society through good governance and social justice initiatives. TI-Kenya is one of the autonomous chapters of the global Transparency International movement that are all bound by a common vision of a corruption-free world. TI-Kenya's vision is "A transparent, accountable and corruption-free Kenya.

### **Project Background**

TI-Kenya through its Policy, Legal and Institutional frameworks program is implementing a project on "Democracy, Governance and Human Rights" which aims to improve access to justice through effective key institutions within the justice sector that respect human rights and the rule of law. The project's overall objective is to contribute to increased respect for human rights, gender equality and strengthened democratic governance at the national and local levels.

### **PROJECT BACKGROUND**

Following the promulgation of the new constitution in 2010, Kenya adopted a devolved system of government leading to 47 distinct county governments each with its own governance structures and own share of resources to manage. The Constitution provides for citizen's engagement in county governance through public participation mechanisms to demand and enhance transparency and accountability amongst the various leaders. For citizens to play their role effectively, access

to information is very crucial.

TI-Kenya has conducted a study to establish the status of governance in the 47 counties. The objectives of the study include; establishing the status of **transparency, accountability, integrity and service delivery** in the counties. A report detailing its national findings and recommendations was published and launched in 2016.

In 2018, the organization did a fresh analysis of the report and intends to publish the findings of individual counties in an interactive website for ease of reference.

### **SCOPE OF WORK**

TI-Kenya therefore seeks to engage a web developer with good design skills to develop a custom WordPress plugin for the CGSR findings to be added on the TI-Kenya Website. The terms of reference for the plugin are as below:

1. Allow importation of data from an excel sheet into system through the WordPress admin panel.
2. Generate interactive reports/pages based on the uploaded data.
3. The pages generated by the plugin should be responsive to allow easy access and navigation across different devices.
4. To ensure the final product blends in with TI-Kenya website and brand colours.

### **QUALIFICATIONS OF THE CONSULTANT**

Candidates, individuals or firms, should possess the following minimum qualifications:

- Hold a degree in IT or related course
- Expert level knowledge in WordPress custom plugin development
- Excellent skills in JavaScript on any JavaScript framework
