Project Background

TI-Kenya through the African Economic Justice programme supported by Diakonia seeks to engage a consultant to conduct an **assessment and review of country mining laws** in Kenya, with a view identifying to what extent the country laws have incorporated provisions of the Africa Mining Vision, particularly cluster 5.

Scope of work

The assessment should cover the following:

1. Briefly detail the mining legislative and policy framework in Kenya
2. An assessment of country mining laws to see to what extent they comply with Principles of the Africa Mining Vision (AMV) particularly cluster 5 of the Africa Mining Vision (AMV). The principles are informed by possible roles that the private sector could voluntarily adopt in addressing the challenges set out in the AMV.

Deliverables

- The consultant should undertake research and define precisely each key issue, succinctly indicate their findings and provide recommendations thereof.
- Documents and or websites used should be referenced appropriately.
- Data Collection and verification will be a desk research.
- All collected data will be verified by the TI research desk.
- The consultant will be expected to facilitate a validation workshop based on the report.

- The research shall be limited to finding out the legal framework as it is within the written laws of the country.
- The report shall be written in English.

Able to show experience working on similar consultancies
