RE: JOINT CIVIL SOCIETY STATEMENT ON THE ELECTION CAMPAIGN FINANCING STANDOFF

The implementation of the Election Campaign Financing Act has faced hurdles since its enactment. A delay of more than two electoral cycles since 2013 without implementation raises grave concerns about subversion of the constitution, which demands regulation of the use of money in elections. Over the last week, the country has witnessed yet fresh attempts by Parliament to delay the implementation of the law on campaign financing.

Leading Civil Society Organizations in Constitutional Governance, Elections, Transparency and Accountability, and Human Rights namely: Transparency International Kenya (TI-Kenya), Centre for Multiparty Democracy (CMD-K), Elections Observation Group (ELOG), Federation of Women Lawyers (FIDA-Kenya), Constitution and Reform Education Consortium (CRECO) and Mzalendo Trust who have engaged on this process since the enactment of Constitution of Kenya 2010, will issue a joint statement detailing the legitimate public interest in regulating Election Campaign Finance for the 2022 elections.
