## RE: JOINT CIVIL SOCIETY STATEMENT ON IEBC'S REVOCATION OF THE ELECTION SPENDING GUIDELINES AND LOW VOTER REGISTRATION TURN OUT

The implementation of the Election Campaign Financing Act 2013 has once again been derailed after the Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission (IEBC) vide a gazette notice dated 5th October 2021 revoked the contributions and spending limits it had gazzetted on the 9th August 2021.

Leading Civil Society Organizations in Constitutional Governance, Elections, Transparency and Accountability, and Human Rights namely: Transparency International Kenya (TI-Kenya), Centre for Multiparty Democracy (CMD-K), Elections Observation Group (ELOG), Federation of Women Lawyers (FIDA-Kenya), Constitution and Reform Education Consortium (CRECO) and Mzalendo Trust will issue a joint statement detailing recommendations to regulate Election Campaign Finance for the 2022 general elections, and the ongoing nationwide enhanced continuous voter registration (ECVR) drive.
